SCHOOL UNIFORM

SMART WATCHES

ARC ECO CLUB

The first ARC Eco-club session involved the students sharing their ideas about how we can improve the school environment. They came up with a number of suggestions such as creating wildlife habitats, educating others about single-use plastics and making bird feeders and nest boxes.



They also helped to plant the final trees in our Coronation orchard. These trees were kindly donated by the <u>Veolia Orchard</u> project. This project is supported by <u>Veolia's Sustainable Schools programme</u>. Each orchard is intended to become a learning resource for students, empowering them to improve their local environment and combat climate change.

We now have 8 pear and apple trees planted in a semi-circle to represent a 'C' for King Charles. The students plan to write to the King to let him know about this.

ASTHMA



If your child has a diagnosis of asthma, they should have a reliever inhaler in school at **all**

times and must take it with them when on school trips. This applies, even if your child has 'mild' asthma, as asthma attacks can be unpredictable.

As peak hay fever season approaches, asthma symptoms may be more severe, especially after playing out on the field.

Please check the expiry date, as out-of-date inhalers may be less effective. Details of treating <u>asthma attacks in children</u> can be found here.

road safety

We regularly talk to our students about the importance of road safety. However, we occasionally have reports of unsafe behaviour, especially on Gainsborough Drive. This has included children cycling down the middle of the road, playing 'chicken' and crossing the road without looking.

Please talk to your children about the risks they may be taking and remind them how to walk/cycle safely to and from school.
